A special meeting of the Wayne City Council was held on Monday, May 2, 2011, at 7:00 p.m. in the Council Chamber of Wayne City Hall, 3355 South Wayne Road.

Mayor Haidous called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and led the Council and the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

**05-11-0133** Motion by McEachern, seconded by Rowe and unanimously carried, it was resolved to approve the Minutes of the Special Meeting of April 19, 2011, as printed.

**05-11-0134** Motion by Dobrowolski, seconded by Rowe and unanimously carried, it was resolved to approve the Minutes of the Regular Meeting of April 19, 2011, as printed.

A public hearing was held to consider a tax abatement for Boise Cascade Corporation. Peter J. McInerney presented the process to the City Council. Jeff Wiska from Boise Cascade explained the investment in the property.

There were no comments expressed by the City Council or the public.

RESOLUTION APPROVING APPLICATION OF BOISE CASCADE HOLDINGS LLC  
FOR INDUSTRIAL FACILITIES TAX EXEMPTION CERTIFICATE

WHEREAS, On June 20, 1989, the City Council, following a duly noticed public hearing, established a Plant Rehabilitation District at 36253 Michigan Avenue, consisting of approximately 25.77 acres, pursuant to Public Act 198 of 1974, as amended; and

WHEREAS, On March 16, 2011, Boise Cascade Holdings LLC filed an application, dated 3-14-11, for an Industrial Facilities Tax Exemption Certificate for a proposed investment of \$3,050,000.00 consisting of building improvements in the amount of \$2,500,000.00 plus \$550,000.00 for machinery, equipment, furniture and fixtures within said plant rehabilitation district; and

WHEREAS, On May 2, 2011, before acting on said application, the City of Wayne City Council held a duly noticed public hearing, at which time members of the public, as well as representatives of the legislative body of each taxing unit which levies ad valorem property taxes in the City were invited to attend and be heard; and

WHEREAS, construction of the facility and installation of the new machinery and equipment had not begun earlier than six (6) months before March 16, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the completion of the facility and installation of the new machinery and equipment is calculated to, and will at the time of issuance of the certificate, have the reasonable likelihood to retain, create or prevent the loss of employment in Wayne; and

WHEREAS, the aggregate state equalized value of property proposed to be exempt from ad valorem taxes within the City of Wayne, after granting this certificate, considered together with the aggregate state equalized value of property exempt under certificates previously granted and currently in force, will exceed 5% of the state equalized value of the City of Wayne; and

WHEREAS, the City of Wayne and Boise Cascade Holdings LLC have entered into a written agreement to be filed with the Michigan Department of Treasury as required by Public Act 198 of 1974, as amended;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

1. The City of Wayne City Council finds and determines that the granting of the Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate, considered together with the aggregate amount of certificates previously granted and currently in force under Public Act 198 of 1974, as amended, shall not have the effect of substantially impeding the operation of the City of Wayne or impairing the financial soundness of a taxing unit which levies ad valorem property taxes in the City of Wayne.
2. The application of the Boise Cascade Holdings LLC, dated March 14, 2011 for an Industrial Facilities Tax Exemption Certificate for the Company's proposed investment of \$3,050,000.00 consisting of building improvements in the amount of \$2,500,000.00 plus \$550,000.00 for machinery, equipment, furniture and fixtures within the established plant rehabilitation district is hereby approved; and
3. The Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate, when issued, shall be and remain in force and effect for a period of six (6) years after completion.

4. The Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized to execute the formal documents as required by law and the City Manager or City Manager's designee is authorized to execute the necessary documents as permitted by law.

## **DESCRIPTION: WAYNE BANQUET & ACTIVITY CENTER**

### **Explanation of Fees and Programs**

#### **Drop-In Line Dancing**

This is an opportunity to exercise in a fun and enjoyable atmosphere. The instructor fee depends on the number of participants and how long they dance. The fee is paid directly to the instructor. Fifty cents (\$0.50) per person is paid to the City of Wayne. One dollar (\$1.00) per person/per half hour is paid to the Instructor.

#### **Tai-Chi Classes**

##### **Beginner**

This is a no impact exercise. It helps with balance, posture, muscle toning and breathing. The sessions are ten weeks and are on a progressive basis. There is a minimum of 10 participants required. This class is offered in the evening. There is a \$60.00 instructor fee per ten week session.

##### **Intermediate**

This is a continuation to the beginner class. It is a more challenging class for participants. Sessions are ten weeks and there is a minimum of 8 participants required to meet the instructor fee of \$60.00 per session.

##### **Advanced**

This is a continuation to the intermediate class. Sessions are ten weeks and there is a minimum of 8 participants required to meet the instructor fee of \$60.00 per session.

#### **Mature Driver Workshop**

The Traffic Improvement Association offers a 3-day course designed to help mature drivers self evaluate their driving skills, compensate for physical changes due to aging, improve driving strategies, and continue to drive for as long and as safely as possible. Lunch is offered the first two days, the third day is an optional on-the-road evaluation in the driver's own vehicle. The instructor fee is \$23.00 per person/per session and goes directly to the Traffic Improvement Association.

#### **Golden Hour Club**

This group meets on Thursday's for a pot-luck luncheon and business meetings. It is also a chance to have speakers and holiday parties. The members meet every Thursday from approximately 10:30am-1:30pm or 3:00pm, depending on the activities planned. The Golden Hour Club has its own dues and members pay directly to the Club.

#### **Sometimes Travelers Club**

The membership includes membership card, name tag, and mailings. This group travels to various outings. Membership fee is \$5.00 per fiscal year.

## **DESCRIPTION: SENIOR ACTIVITY PROGRAMS**

### **Explanation of Fees and Programs (Cont'd)**

#### **Material Girls Quilting Club**

Women get together to socialize and work on quilts. The instructors fee is \$5.00 per person up to \$35.00 and is paid to offset the cost of the facility manager.

#### **Immunization Clinic**

This program is coordinated with Maxium Health. It offers flu and/or pneumonia shots to seniors. It is a one day clinic and is by appointment only. The fee is determined by the hospital. The majority of the vaccines are covered by Medicare B.

#### **Health Screening**

This program is offered to seniors, especially those with limited or no insurance, to have some of health screening done. They usually provide a cholesterol, glucose, blood pressure, eye exams, hearing exams, prostate screening, bone density, weight, etc. There isn't a charge for persons 60 and older, but for ages 50-59, a lab fee will be charged.

#### **Tax Assistance Program (TCE)**

AARP offers this program for seniors and others with priority given to seniors who file basic tax forms. Tax forms are prepared and e-filed. This program is free to seniors. Donations are accepted to offset any office supply costs.
