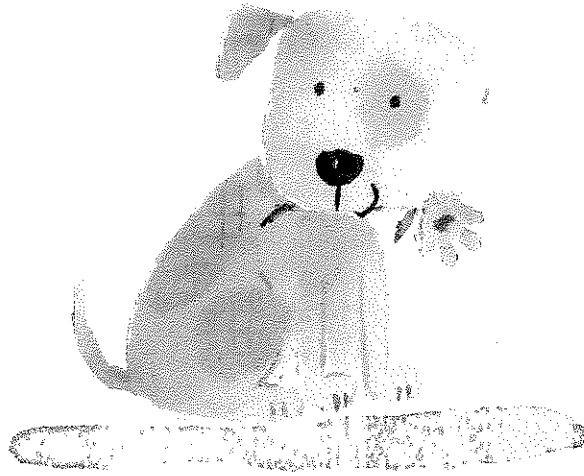

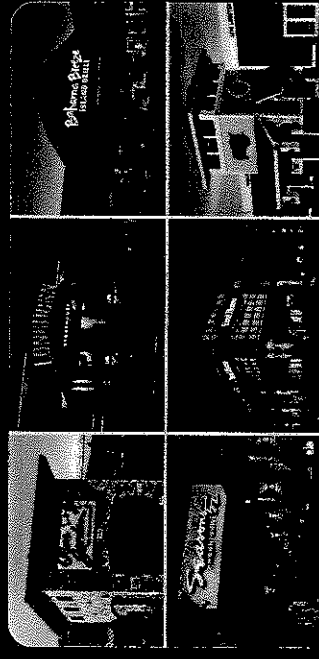

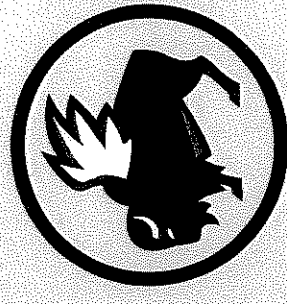

RE: **PURCHASE OF 5 MOTOROLA APX6000 MOBILE POLICE RADIOS**

As you are aware, several departments in Western Wayne County including the Wayne Police Department have switched over to the Michigan Public Safety Communication System (MPSCS) radio system. During this transition, I have learned that our current Motorola XTS 3000 radios that were purchased in 1999 are at the end of life and do not function optimally on the state's MPSCS system. Many of my officers have reported sporadic connectivity in several areas throughout the city and have expressed these outages to be major officer safety issues.

With the help of the Wayne Rotary Foundation, a \$20,000.00 grant was obtained through Ford Motor Company for the purchase of new police mobile radios. I contacted ComSource Inc who is the provider for Motorola and obtained a quote. The pricing for the Motorola APX 6000 radios is based on the State of Michigan Contract #071B2200101. We originally purchased Motorola radios when we first went to the 800 mhz system. Our current radios have held up over the years. The Motorola APX 6000 radios are the model of choice for front line officers and are currently used by departments in the area. The purchase of these radios would require a signed agreement with MPSCS and a one time activation fee of \$250.00 per radio. The total purchase price for (5) radios, battery charger, accessories and additional batteries is \$20,070.00. I have attached a quote for the equipment for your review. This price does not include the activation fee with MPSCS.

I am asking that you forward this request to City Council for their review and approval of the purchase of new portable radios. The purchase of these radios will allow the patrol division to communicate with dispatch or fellow officers without the above reported issues. The radios will be assigned to road patrol officers and the radios will be exchanged between officers at shift change.

To All MPSCS Subscribers:

Michigan's Public Safety Communications System (MPSCS) values its customers and their investment in public safety communication resources for Michigan citizens. To serve you better, the MPSCS has restructured its subscriber fee. **Subscribers will no longer be charged a semi-annual per radio subscriber fee.** In its place, a standard one-time radio subscriber fee of \$250 per radio will be applied at the activation of a new or replaced radio on the MPSCS. To align with the billing cycle, application of the fee is retroactive to October 1, 2015.

Subscribers can expect several benefits from the new subscriber fee:

- Simplified billing tied to the same standardized services
- Reduced costs from 50 to 90 percent over the course of the radio lifecycle for most customers
- Continued growth for public safety interoperability and adoption of the MPSCS

Existing credit agreements will continue to apply to the revised radio subscriber fee.

To activate the new subscriber fee:

- Customers in good standing with up-to-date subscriber fee payments are automatically enrolled. No action is required.
- Customers with an outstanding balance for MPSCS subscriber fees must make payment to the state of Michigan before participating in the new subscriber fee structure.
