A regular meeting of the Wayne City Council was held on Tuesday, June 6, 2017, at 8:00 p.m. at the Wayne City Hall, 3355 South Wayne Road.

Mayor Rowe called the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m. and led the Council and the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

06-17-0143 Motion by Gabriel, seconded by Sutton and unanimously carried, it was resolved to approve the agenda as printed.

06-17-0144 Motion by Gabriel, seconded by Miller, the motion carried 6-1 (Sanders), it was resolved to approve the Regular Meeting of May 16, as written.

06-17-0145 Motion by Gabriel, seconded by Sutton, the motion carried 5-2 (Rhaesa, Porter), it was resolved to approve the Special Meeting of May 23, as written.

06-17-0146 Motion by Miller, seconded by Gabriel and unanimously carried, it was resolved to approve the request from Wayne Historical Society to park on Josephine Street and a portion of the Dynamite Park entrance on Sunday, October 1, 2017 for the Cemetery Walk at St. Mary's Cemetery.

06-17-0147 Motion by Gabriel, seconded by Miller and unanimously carried, it was resolved to approve the resolution to proclaim June as Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender and Questioning (LGBTQ) Pride Month in the City of Wayne.

06-17-0148 Motion by Miller, seconded by Sanders and unanimously carried, it was resolved to have the second reading and approval of Ordinance #2017-03 an amendment to Chapter 1282 - Parking to require paved parking and storage in all zoning districts.

06-17-0152 Motion by Sutton, seconded by Gabriel and unanimously carried, it was resolved to Approve the Memorandum of Agreement with Wayne Metro Community Action Agency for the participation in the Water Residential Assistance Program (WRAP).
